Vocational BTEC Cambridge National WJEC Vocational Award


All qualifications are Level 1/2 which means you can achieve a Grade 9-1 (or equivalent) in all.

All GCSEs are linear – this means that the examinations are taken at the end of the course.

All our Key Stage 4 qualifications are worth the equivalent of 1 GCSE and all can lead to further study within the Sixth Form or a college.

What is the English Baccalaureate?

"The English Baccalaureate was introduced as a performance measure in the 2010 performance tables.

It is not a qualification in itself.

The measure recognises where pupils have secured a grade 5 or better across a group of academic subjects:

- English (both Language and Literature)
- Mathematics
- Two Sciences
- History or Geography
- A "Language."

Thornleigh Salesian College hosts the Catholic Post-16 provision for all of Bolton. All our KS4 courses offer progression routes through to Post-16 education.

Raising Participation Age


All students who are currently in Year 9 must remain in full-time education or training until the age of 18. For the majority of students this will be at Thornleigh Salesian College although some will follow apprenticeships etc. elsewhere.

It's never too early to start thinking about matching courses to careers and further study.

Nationally, any student who does not achieve a **Grade 4** in English and/or Maths must continue to study these beyond the age of 16.
