


Tools for Learning

Your child is expected to be ready to learn every day. This is helped by having the following essential tools for learning. Bags should be packed the night before school.

The top 5 essentials packed in a suitable pencil case in an appropriate and hard wearing bag:

- 1) Two pens
- 2) Two pencils
- 3) One ruler
- 4) One eraser
- 5) Scientific calculator

Desirable:

- 1) Pencil sharpener
- 2) A highlighter

Students are also expected to bring a reading book with them every day

Specific subjects may require students to have specialist equipment. For example:


Home Technology - Students will be required to purchase ingredients for practical cooking lessons.

PE - Students will be required to bring a separate PE bag containing their PE kit.

Music - It may be that your child continues or begins learning a musical instrument.

Attendance

Regular attendance is not just a legal requirement, but it is vital for students to maximise their learning and achieve their full potential here at Thornleigh Salesian College. Good attendance is seen as **97% plus**. Below is the Thornleigh Attendance Diamond that we use to review attendance.



Your child is twice as likely to achieve their potential if their attendance is 97% compared to a child whose attendance is 90%. Good attendance habits are built in year 7 and you as a parent have the biggest impact on your child's attendance and GCSE achievement. Research shows that only 45% of students who have attendance below 95% achieve 5 or more good GCSE grades; whereas; 82% of students who have 99% or more achieve 5 or more GCSE grades.

You may be aware that the Department for Education has recently announced national changes to penalty notices issued for unauthorised absence in term time. These changes came into effect on 19 August 2024. The government has directed schools to consider fines if a pupil misses 10 sessions (equivalent to 5 days) in a rolling period of 10 school weeks. Absence fines have also changed to £80, or £160 if not paid within 21 days. Any second penalty notice issued to the same parent for the same child within a rolling 3-year period will be issued at the rate of £160 to be paid within 28 days with no option for a discounted rate. It is important to note that lateness after the registers close is counted by the Department for Education as 1 absence so this makes it important that your child arrives at school on time.

To report an absence to school please either call the school and leave a message with the absence team on 01204 301351 or email attendance@thornleigh.bolton.sch.uk ensuring that you leave your child's name, form group, year group and reason for absence. You need to inform the school each day of your child's absence if they are absent for more than one day.

The Department for Education also advise that from September 2024 no holidays will be agreed upon during term time and that any term time holidays that are taken after the start of the 2024/25 academic year will be treated under the new legislation, regardless of when the holiday is booked.

Preventing your child from missing school - what you can do

- Make sure your child understands the importance of good attendance and punctuality
- Take an interest in their education ask about school work and encourage them to get involved in school activities
- Discuss any problems they may have at school
- Encourage resilience by not allowing your child to take time off school for minor ailments
 particularly those which would not prevent you from going to work
- Arrange appointments and outings after school hours, at weekends or during school holidays

Uniform and Appearance

All students attending Thornleigh Salesian College are expected to wear full school uniform.

We expect students to represent Thornleigh Salesian College with pride and have high expectations for our students' standard of appearance.

Items marked * must be obtained from the outfitters. Other items can be purchased where you will.

Girls' Uniform *PLEASE LABEL ALL ITEMS WITH YOUR CHILD'S NAME*

- Plain black formal school shoes (These must be below the ankle with a maximum heel of 3cm/1inch – no boots or shoe boots, no trainers, leisure shoes or canvas pumps. Nike/Adidas/Asics/New Balance/Vans/Converse shoes are not permitted)
- Brown school skirt (special dye): top of the knee length to allow for growth during the year and/or brown trousers (available only from school outfitters)*
- Pale blue blouse (shirt-style, top button must be fastened)
- Clip-on school tie*
- White knee socks or black/brown tights. Black tights must be a minimum of 60 denier
- School blazer *

Girls' Optional Uniform Items

- Outdoor coats (including anoraks and rain coats) must be plain black. The school PE
 rain jacket may also be worn as an outdoor coat. Hooded/Zip-Up Hooded jumpers
 (including the school version) and tracksuit jackets are not permitted as an outdoor
 coat.
- Brown school pullover (special dye) *

- Black trousers (standard fitting no skinny fit, cords, denims or canvas trousers allowed)
- Plain white shirt (not patterned top button must be fastened)

- Football boots with plastic moulded or rubber studs (required for astro and grass pitches)

GENERAL NOTES ON UNIFORM. PERSONAL APPEARANCE AND CORE RULES

- No jewellery except watches may be worn by boys or girls. For safety reasons, earrings may
 not be worn in school. Students must remove these before going to lessons. Tattoos, body
 piercings and jewelled teeth are not allowed.
- No nail varnish, false nails, false tan or make-up may be used at school. Fingernails must be short, neat and clean. Students will be required to remove makeup and nail varnish using wipes provided by school.
- Hair styles must be in accordance with standards laid down by the Senior Leadership Team.
 No extreme haircuts, (including 'V' cuts, lines or shaved styles) are allowed. Hair length at the back and sides must not be below a number 2. Hair must be one natural colour. Students will not be allowed to access classes in the event of these rules being broken.
- A hard wearing school bag is required for books/homework, as well as for basic equipment such as pens/biro, pencil, ruler, calculator, rubber, highlighters and coloured pencils. This basic equipment MUST be brought to school each day along with any necessary books, kit or equipment. NOTE - Parents are requested to maintain a close check on the condition of their child's text and exercise books.
- Fashions change with such rapidity that it is not possible to cater for every possibility in print.
 The school must, therefore, reserve the right to decide what is and what is not allowed, both in
 uniform and general appearance, in cases not catered for by specific rules. It would be
 advisable, when in doubt, for parents to contact the school before spending money on
 styles/items that might not be allowed.
- If, for exceptional reasons, large amounts of money or valuables need to be brought into school, they should be given into the Year 7 office for safe keeping. However, please note that this is a facility offered to aid security; any teacher providing such a service is not accepting responsibility for the money or valuables. Any valuables left in pockets or bags are left at students' own risk.
- Mobile phones are not allowed to be used in school at any time. This includes Apple Watches.
 When on site, mobile phones must be switched off and out of sight securely in a school bag.
 Any student seen using a mobile phone in any way and at any time during the school day will have it confiscated. The parent/carer must collect a confiscated mobile phone. The phone will NOT be returned to the student.
- Students are not permitted to wear headphones and/or airpods during the school day. Any student using personal headphones without permission in class will have them confiscated.
- Energy drinks, fizzy drinks and chewing gum are not permitted at any time in school. Students are not permitted to bring in large quantities of sweets, chocolate and/or crisps. Students with these items will have them confiscated and they will not be returned.
- While every effort will be made by normal supervision, discipline and inquiry to safeguard students' property, the school authorities cannot accept responsibility in the case of damage or loss. Parents may deem it advisable to insure against such loss with their House Contents Insurance Policy. It is the student's responsibility to hand in valuable items to a member of staff at the start of a PE lesson. School will not accept any responsibility for loss or damage to any item not handed in.
- Students must not buy or sell any goods in school. Any student found to be doing this, will have the goods confiscated before being issued with a senior leadership consequence.
- Students are not permitted to use the toilet during lesson time unless they qualify for a toilet pass by providing medical evidence to the Year team. Students must use the toilet before school, at break time, at lunchtime and after school.


Visit the website www.schoolgateway.com
