Pope Francis: A Gift to the Church and to the young

On March 13, 2013, history was made when Cardinal Jorge Mario Bergoglio of Argentina was elected as the 266th pope of the Catholic Church. Taking the name Francis (after Saint Francis of Assisi) he became the first Jesuit pope, the first from the Americas and the first non-European pope in over 1,200 years. From the beginning, Pope Francis has presented himself as a shepherd who leads with humility, compassion, and a deep concern for the marginalized, the poor and the young.

A Shepherd With the Smell of the Sheep: Pope Francis has repeatedly called for a Church that goes out to the peripheries, "a field hospital after battle," offering healing and hope. He famously asked priests to be "shepherds living with the smell of the sheep" - deeply connected to the realities of those they serve. His personal simplicity, seen in his choice to live in a modest Vatican guesthouse instead of the papal apartments and his emphasis on mercy over judgment, have made him a deeply relatable and admired figure across the globe.

A Mission Rooted in Mercy, Hope and Encounter: Central to Pope Francis' mission is the call to mercy and encounter. From the Year of Mercy in 2016 to the current Jubilee Year 2025 themed Pilgrims of Hope, he invites all people to open their hearts to God and one another. His teachings consistently emphasize care for creation (Laudato Si'), social justice (Fratelli Tutti), and walking together as a synodal Church (Synod on Synodality).

For Pope Francis, hope is not abstract - it is lived out in how we care for others, welcome the excluded, and build peace and fraternity. His papacy is marked by deep pastoral concern and a relentless push for the Church to remain relevant and rooted in the Gospel.

A Message to us: The mission of Pope Francis resonates powerfully with the identity and spirit of Thornleigh Salesian College. As a Salesian community walking in the footsteps of Don Bosco, we find a natural harmony between the Pope's pastoral priorities and our educational mission.

His call for young people to be "pilgrims of hope" is an echo of Don Bosco's lifelong work of empowering the youth to discover their purpose, grow in virtue, and live with joy. Pope Francis challenges young people not to be passive observers of history, but protagonists in shaping a better future. His words during World Youth Day and in his apostolic exhortation Christus Vivit affirm that young people are not just the future of the Church - they are its vibrant present.

What does it means to us: Being a community of hope, where every young person feels valued and encouraged. Cultivating a culture of encounter, where diversity is respected, dialogue is cherished and no one walks alone.

Living with a Salesian heart, always ready to accompany, to educate by example and to bring joy to those around us.



A New Chapter for the Church in the Modern World

The Catholic Church has entered a new era with the election of Pope Leo XIV, chosen by the College of Cardinals to lead the Church at a time of global transformation and spiritual renewal. As the successor of Pope Francis, Pope Leo XIV steps into a world marked by rapid technological change, social complexity, and deep human longing for peace, justice and meaning. His election comes as a moment of hope - not just for Catholics, but for people of goodwill across the globe.

Though newly elected, Pope Leo XIV is already known for his deep spirituality, pastoral sensitivity, and commitment to dialogue. He brings a clear voice rooted in tradition yet courageously open to the challenges of the present. His first words as pope were simple but powerful: "Let us walk together - God's people, in faith, hope, and love."

From his early ministry as a bishop to his service within the Roman Curia, he has shown a consistent desire to build bridges between faith and science, rich and poor, young and old, tradition and innovation.

In his inaugural homily, Pope Leo XIV highlighted key priorities for his pontificate:

Unity in Diversity: Emphasizing that the Church must be a home for all people, especially those on the margins.

Faithful to the Gospel, Open to the World: Calling for a renewed evangelization that speaks to modern hearts and minds without compromising the truth of Christ.

Care for Creation and the Human Person: Reaffirming the Church's commitment to ecological justice and the dignity of every human being.

Youth and Hope: Placing young people at the center of the Church's mission and urging them to be co-creators of a more just and compassionate world.

For us at Thornleigh Salesian College, the election of Pope Leo XIV is an invitation to renew our own sense of mission. Inspired by the spirit of Don Bosco and the leadership of this new pope, we are called to deepen our commitment to faith, hope, and joyful service.

Just as Pope Leo XIV invites the world to "walk together," so too are we called to walk alongside our young people -especially those who struggle - and accompany them on their journey toward fullness of life.

This means:

- Continuing to be "signs and bearers of God's love", as Don Bosco envisioned.
- Creating a school where each student feels seen, heard, and valued.
- Encouraging every young person to be a leader of hope and change in their own lives and communities.

As Pope Leo XIV begins his journey as shepherd of the Church, we pray for him with hearts full of trust. May he be guided by the Holy Spirit as he brings the light of Christ to the modern world. And may we at Thornleigh Salesian College respond to his call by being faithful disciples, joyful educators and pilgrims of hope, walking onward with the global Church into this new chapter of grace and promise.



In a historic moment for the Salesian family, Fr Fabio Attard was elected Rector Major of the Salesians of Don Bosco during the 29th General Chapter held in March 2025. He now becomes the 11th successor of Don Bosco, entrusted with leading the Congregation into a new chapter of mission and service.

The election took place at the Mother House in Valdocco, Turin, where 220 provincials and delegates from around the world gathered to discern the future

leadership of the Salesian Order.
