THE CHILD OF HOPE

Each Christmas, we return to the humble stable in Bethlehem where Jesus, the Son of God, entered our world as a tiny, vulnerable child. His birth was not announced in palaces or celebrated by the powerful, but welcomed by shepherds, travellers, and ordinary families. In this simple scene, God reveals a profound truth: hope often begins in quiet, unexpected places.

For us as a Salesian community - parents, students, and families - the birth of Jesus speaks directly to our daily lives. Don Bosco reminded us that every young person is a "seed of goodness," carrying within them the same promise of hope that shone from the manger. The Christ Child shows us that God chooses to work through simplicity, kindness, and trust.

Our Carol Service theme, "The Child of Hope," invites us to rediscover this message. Jesus comes not to overwhelm us, but to walk beside us. The Salesian Missions are celebrating the 150th anniversary of their first missionary expedition - a moment of thanksgiving, renewal, and renewed commitment to serving disadvantaged youth worldwide.

On 11 November 1875, St John Bosco sent the first group of ten Salesian missionaries from Valdocco, Turin, to Argentina, inspired by his burning desire to help poor and abandoned young people and guided by his motto: "Give me souls, take away the rest."

From that small beginning, the Salesian mission has grown to 137 countries, reaching millions through schools, oratories, and social projects across South America, Africa, Asia, and beyond. This missionary spirit, deeply rooted in the Salesian "DNA," continues today through the entire Salesian Family - SDBs, FMAs, Cooperators, and lay volunteers - united in their mission of educational love and hope.

Rector Major Releases Strenna 2026: "Do Whatever He Tells You"

The Salesian Family worldwide joyfully welcomes the first Strenna of the new Rector Major, Fr Fabio Attard, marking a significant moment at the start of his term. Each year, the Strenna offers the Salesian Family a shared theme for reflection, prayer, and action - a unifying invitation to grow together in mission and spirituality.

For 2026, the theme is drawn from Mary's words at the Wedding at Cana: "Do whatever He tells you." Under the title "Believers, free to serve," the Strenna invites members of the Salesian Family to embrace a courageous and active faith rooted in the Gospel. Fr Attard highlights how true Christian freedom flows from listening to God and leads to generous service, especially to the young and vulnerable.

The Strenna calls for a spirituality that is practical and discerning - a spiritual intelligence that recognizes God's action in daily life and inspires us to move from words to deeds. This year's theme resonates as the Salesian Family marks significant anniversaries, including the 150th anniversary of the Salesian missions, making the call to renewal and service even more meaningful.

Grounded in faith, freedom, and service, the Strenna 2026 encourages all Salesians - religious, lay, and young people - to walk with Mary as disciples who listen, trust, and act.



RE Curriculum Updates

Key Stage 3: This term in Key Stage 3 Religious Education, students have been exploring the Christian understanding of Creation, focusing on the belief that God brought the world into existence out of nothing. Alongside this they have been studying the prophets and the theme of promise in the Old Testament, including the promise of Christ fulfilled through the Incarnation. These topics have encouraged students to think deeply about the foundations of Christian belief and how these teachings continue to shape faith today.


Key Stage 4: Key Stage 4 students have been working hard to develop their evaluative skills in preparation for their GCSE examinations. They have also been participating in the study of Judaism as a world religion which has helped broaden their understanding of faith in a global context. This term all students have had the opportunity to take part in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, a Catholic practice where individuals reflect on their actions, express their repentance and receive absolution. It has been a valuable experience that encourages personal reflection as well as spiritual growth.

Key Stage 5: Our Key Stage 5 CORE RE students have been studying Catholic Social Teaching and reflecting on how these principles can be applied in their daily lives as responsible and compassionate members of society. In Philosophy and Ethics, Alevel students have been analysing the work of key philosophers and ethicists and applying their ideas to contemporary issues such as abortion, assisted suicide and truthfulness. A highlight of the term was attending a joint Salesian Sixth Form conference in London. Students had the opportunity to hear Professor Daphne Hampson speak on Christianity and feminism and Reverend Dr Martin Poulsom SDB present on the Ontological Argument for the existence of God. It was an inspiring day that enriched their understanding of both theology and philosophy.


