How and when the assessments will take place



All other subjects

Students will not have an EOY assessment in PE
Year 9 students will not have an EOY assessment in Drama

All subjects will provide revision lists and material prior to the tests

Effective general revision guidance



Our top 10

- 1. A schedule and checklist tricky for these assessments!
- 2. **Short**, **focussed bursts** of revision 25 minutes per topic/subject. 5 minute break.
- 3. **Combine multiple subjects** into one revision session space out the practice
- 4. **Resources** pens, pencils, ruler, highlighters, calculator, notes, snack and drink
- 5. A designated and quiet study space ideally at a table, not bedroom or sofa
- 6. **No mobile phone** can it go into an agreed place for the duration of revision
- 7. **Habit stacking** attach revision to before an enjoyable/routine habit
- 8. **Nutrition and exercise** water, low sugar, 30 minutes exercise a day
- 9. **Sleep** start now, not just the night before the assessment
- 10. Motivation and rewards

Effective general revision technique 1: FLASHCARDS





Effective general revision technique 1: FLASHCARDS



Organisation

- Use a pack of index cards or neatly cut up paper
- Hole punch the cards in the top corner and hold together topics/subjects with a key ring loop

Writing out the card

- Write one question/topic heading on one side of the card
- Write the answer(s) on the reverse side of the same card

Quizzing


- Ask the question and say the answer out loud/write the answer on a piece of paper
- Turn the card over and check the answer is correct


Improving

RAG the cards or reorganize into areas of strength/areas for improvement

Effective general revision technique 2: BRAIN DUMP



Organisation

- Decide on a topic to revise
- Have a blank sheet of paper, pencil, eraser, highlighter

Dump

- Write down everything you know and can remember about the topic without looking at notes
- To help organise the writing, use a spider diagram, mind map, bullet points
- It might help to order the writing then EG, into a table

Check

- Check the writing against notes/revision materials/guide
- Add anything that has been missed in a different colour to identify any gaps

Improving

Repeat the process to reduce the number of gaps

Effective general revision technique 3: PRACTICE!



- Attempt realistic practice questions under timed conditions
- For example, using sites such as Dr.Frost or SENECA learning
- Signposted by class teachers

Subject specific revision







Access Arrangements



- Formal Access Arrangements for GCSEs start in Year 10 for mock exams
- An external assessment to confirm eligibility for Access Arrangements (i.e. extra time) in Key Stage 4 (GCSEs) happens early in Year 10
- Subject Leaders have been asked to make the assessments inclusive so that all students can attempt them
- Students in Key Stage 3 with an EHCP will have their recommended Access Arrangements
- A cohort of students who will benefit from being in a smaller room for Maths and English, will be offered a smaller room (class size) rather than sit in the Sports Hall. They will have access to a reader (reader pen) and prompt.
- Students who use a laptop as their 'normal way of working' will be able to use a laptop for assessments
