- Daily review be honest about yours too


#### Sleep

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

The mark schemes will tell you how marks are awarded for each question. #### **Revision Strategy of the Week**

- Each week for the next ten weeks we will encourage your child to use one of 3 revision strategy every Monday in tutorial time
- They should try to use this strategy in at least one of their subjects that week - this will arm them with a number of approaches
- They will find some more useful than others everyone learns differently
- The essential thing is finding which is most EFFECTIVE for them (not just the one that they like!)

- Simply reading through notes or books
- Taking a scattergun approach
- Highlighting texts (if it's all you do!)
- Re-reading
- Summarising text with no understanding




#### Using flashcards



Muhammad Ali, arguably the greatest boxer in the history of the sport. He was born in 1942 in Louisville, Kentucky in the US. He was named after his father, Cassius Clay Sr, who was named after the 19<sup>th</sup> century abolitionist politician Cassius Clay. He changed his name to Muhammad Ali in 1964. He became a boxers at the age of 12. As an amateur boxer he won many titles culminating in the Light Heavyweight gold medal in the 1960 Olympics in Rome. When Ali returned home he was so proud he wore his medal wherever he went. After a week he went to a café to order a drink. The waiter said, "I'm sorry we don't serve coloured people". Ali was so cross by this he threw his medal into a river. He turned professional at the age of 18. Ali's record was 100 wins, 5 losses; an impressive record.

Ali became World Champion at the age of 22. Ali was famous for his unorthodox fighting style. Ali brought strategy and tactics into the boxing ring. With his fast moving, he was adept at dodging punches and with his fancy footwork which was knows as the "Ali Shuffle". He also used mind gamed and often out psyched his opponents before a match. He once famously said he would "float like a butterfly and sting like a bee".
