Thornleigh Sixth Form presents many fantastic opportunities for you to learn outside the classroom, experience different cultures and enrich your understanding of your curriculum subjects.

Shrewsbury Prison

Our Social Science trip to Shrewsbury Prison provides students with a truly unique insight into prison life. Shrewsbury Prison is a decommissioned Victorian prison and is now a multi-purpose tourist attraction, delivering heritage tours, high impact events and educational programmes. During the trip students will be given a comprehensive tour of the prison, including the prison cells, segregation units, the healthcare unit and the execution room. They will also be given the opportunity to have topical discussions with experienced prison officers. Students will experience what it is like to be processed into a prison and will complete a team 'cell escape' activity which will encourage working collaboratively with their peers. Interesting fact... The BBC prison drama 'Time' was filmed at Shrewsbury Prison!

Army Visit and Residential Trip

Sixth Form students will participate in a number of team building activities delivered by Soldiers from the Army Outreach Team. The activities included ravine crossing, map reading tasks and bridge-building activities, designed to develop team-work and resilience as well as giving those interested in a career in the Army a taste of Army life. Our students will also have the unique opportunity to attend a free Army Work Experience programme at an Army barracks during the spring and summer months.

What one of our Year 13 students had to say about the Army residential trip:

"The Army residential was a great experience where we got a full picture of life in the Army. Throughout the week we spent time engaging in activities vital for life in the Army such as cooking in the field, how to march and how to apply first aid and camouflage. My favourite bit was when we got to traverse a full army assault course at the end of the week. This experience showed me a good representation of what Army life is like and exceeded my expectations. We also learnt key leadership skills like resilience and communication as we had to manage our teams for the week. There is another residential in April and I recommend it to anyone who is interested in the military".

Chester Zoo
