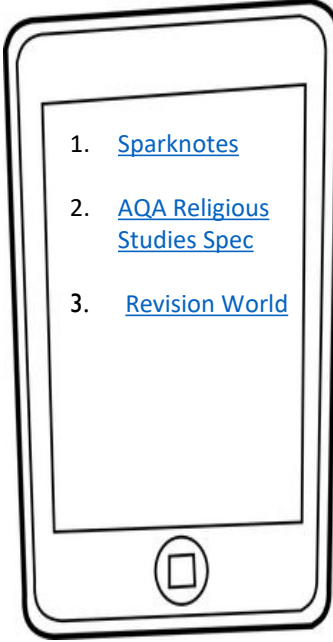

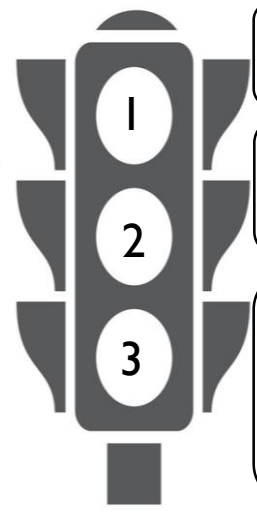

3. Encourage your child to explain to you any key concepts they have learned to develop their explanation skills.

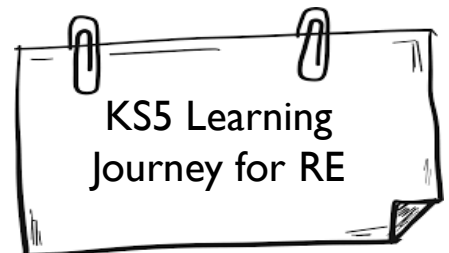
