

The past few weeks have flown by at Thornleigh Sixth Form!



On Wednesday 6th March we are taking all of Year 12 to Manchester Central for the UCAS Discovery exhibition where they will get to meet over 100 unis, colleges and apprenticeship employers face-to-face, they can listen to live expert talks and get the latest advice and information on different careers choices.
