Curriculum and assessment



- All homework instructions entered onto Satchel One on the day that it is set.
- At least 2 days should be left between setting and submission i.e. homework set on a Monday should not be required for submission until Thursday at the earliest.
- All homework should be marked and feedback given.
- Much homework may involve students completing tasks on their individual class on Google Classrooms.
- Materials to support and resources provided to undertake the task independently. Providing students with choice (menus). Parental involvement is desirable, but it should not be essential. Teacher scaffolding is essential





Assessment

- Academic starting points meet where they are at
- GL assessments (NGRT, CAT4 Level D (from Y7) Progress Tests English and Maths (completed in Oct))
- Teacher assessment curriculum driven assessment
- Establishing learning thresholds
 - Foundation, developing, secure, excelling
