

How do we monitor your child's attainment? Learning Logs

- Stuck in your child's book at the start of every topic in every curriculum area.
- Map out the learning pathways taken by students to reach an understanding of a topic.
- Enables you and your child to see the knowledge and understanding of key concepts and ideas that need to be learned to master a topic.








KS3 Assessment Processes 2018

The KS3 assessment pyramid





So what is it?


Show My Homework (SMHW) is a simple, online homework calendar that allows teachers to set homework in advance.

Create Homework




How does it work?

Teachers post homework to the school calendar, and to the student's calendar.




This homework appears on the student's to do list. Once completed, the student can remove it.






School Gateway

- Ability to view timetables
- Reports in the future
- Attendance: Respond to attendance enquiries
- On the app: Send direct messages to the school/receive messages back

Step I:

Download the school Gateway App from either the App Store or Google Play

Alternatively access via the website: https://login.schoolgateway.com

Step 2:

Register with the same email address and mobile number that you have provided to school. Note, if two parents share an email address only one parent can register for the school gateway.

Step 3:

Once registered you will receive a 4 digit PIN to your mobile that you will need to first log in




Faith in Action Award

Principles of the Award

Faith - Service - Reflection

To celebrate the faith journey of young people. Simple and powerful way of reflecting on active faith

Thank You - The Award recognises young people's service to God, the Church and others and gives 'us' a chance to say thank you.

Accessible and Inclusive - From age Y6 - Y13

Raising Aspirations - Acknowledging good work and encouraging young people to do more in particular in the parish.

School and **Parish** base for service.



Pin Award: Discovery

At this early stage, young people will begin a journey of discovering what it means for faith to be active.

- ▶ 20 credits: 10/10
- Completed as a group or class
- Led by teacher/youth leader/catechist/parish rep.
- Examples of service: fundraising; planning an assembly/liturgy; participating in an act of worship, reading at Mass, Altar serving etc.



Bronze Award: Service

Young people at the Bronze Level take the initial steps in responding to their faith, by way of serving others.


- ▶ 35 credits 15/15/5
- Age range: Y7+ (age 11 onwards)
- Independent service
- ► Young people make their own decisions about what service they would like to do.
- Examples of service: minister of the Word; altar server; serving tea and coffee after Mass; plan and participate in a liturgy/reflection.
